God's Grace.

My grace is sufficient for thee: for my strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

2 Corinthians 12:9

Over the past few weeks, I have officiated 2 baby dedications, 9 baptisms, 2 weddings, 4 funerals. These gatherings are part of life and allow us to share and reflect on the joys and concerns in life. Each week at church we come to the Lord as a church family to share our joys and concerns, things we celebrate and ways we can lean on one another for strength and encouragement in the Lord. As witnessed by many holy men and women, God's grace brings so much peace and joy into the human soul that earthly advantages and pleasures seem to be negligible in comparison with it."

How do we obtain the gift of grace? Increase your understanding and experience in Christ, accept Him, follow His teachings faithfully, and act in a manner worthy of the Gospel.

The focus of God's grace is on something being achieved rather than having flaws removed. Strength made perfect in weakness. A shift happens and we turn to God, trust him and remain faithful to what is in-store. May you accept the gift of grace from the Lord and live faithfully.



When Who Am I Yields To I AM

I AM the Moderator – I preside over all Executive Board meetings and special meetings of the church and serve as an ex-officio member of all Committees. I oversee the Officers, Executive Board and all Committees in the performance of their duties as set forth in the By-laws.

I AM the Clerk – I keep records of all regular and special meetings of the Executive Board. I keep a list of members, maintain the official By-laws, present a list of upcoming vacancies of Officers and Committee members to the Nominating Committee.

I AM the Financial Secretary – I receive and record the church operating income, deposit the same weekly and forward copies of deposit slips to the Treasurer. I record all pledges, distribute offering envelopes, record receipts and send semi-annual statements to those pledging. I present a written report at Executive Board meetings and at Annual Meeting present a written report.

I AM the Treasurer – I receive deposit slips from the Financial Secretary and make disbursements under the orders of the Executive Board and in accordance with the annual budget. I record all income and disbursements and present a written report at Executive Board meetings and at Annual Meeting present a written report.

The Nominating Committee will meet November 3rd and 10 th to prepare a slate of candidates for officer and

committee openings for 2025. Officers include Moderator, Clerk, Financial Secretary, Treasurer and assistants to the treasurer and financial secretary. Committees are Deacons, Building & Grounds, Financial Management, Christian Education, Outreach, Worship, Pastoral Relations and Stewardship.

OUTREACH SUNDAY - OCTOBER 20th

The Outreach Committee hopes that you will join us on Sunday, October 20 th during the 10AM service to learn more about three local ministries. On that Sunday we will welcome guest speakers from Granite State Adaptive Sports, Wolfeboro Meals on Wheels, and a local Bolivia Missions trip. This is a wonderful opportunity to hear about the good work that these organizations are doing and ways that we might support their efforts. Below is a summary of these organizations/missions.

Granite State Adaptive Sports –

Empowering individuals, especially those with disabilities, at-risk youth, and Veterans, to develop independence, confidence, life skills and fitness through adaptive sports, therapy, training, and recreation – sustained by community engagement.

Wolfeboro Meals on Wheels - The

Wolfeboro Area Meals on Wheels is a daily program for housebound elderly and disabled clients who are unable to prepare their meals due to physical or cognitive impairments. Each day, Monday-Friday, volunteers deliver hot noon-time meals prepared at the Huggins Hospital kitchen.

Bolivia Missions- A local missions team (Camp Sentinel Joseph Wasson is a team member) will travel to Bolivia in South America with a team of youth and young adults to help train and equip South American missionaries to travel to the 10/40 window, the most unreached part of the world, and a place Americans are largely barred from

entering. The Bolivia team's work consists of language training, speaking at churches, sharing the Gospel with local Quechuan people, and traveling to hard-to-reach places in the Andes Mountains and Amazon river basin to challenge, support, and equip churches.

Since 2008 Melvin Village Community Church has sponsored the annual "Feet for Fuel-Walk for Warmth" Walk-A-Thon to raise funds to assist local families in need of fuel and emergency assistance. Over the years MVCC, with generous support from the Bald Peak Community Fund, has raised over \$200,000 through this effort. During 2023-2024, MVCC has provided over \$15,000 to numerous families in our community in **need of** assistance. This year, with your help, we will continue to make a difference for those in need. Ways you can help include:

- 1. Volunteer to be outside the Melvin Village Post Office to educate the community on what MVCC is doing to help those in need on Saturday, October 19. Donations are also requested. - 2. Put on your walking shoes, sign up sponsors, and join us on Sunday, October 20th at 2:00 PM. Sponsorship forms can be found in The Visitor, on the church website, at church, or obtained by calling the church office. We will assemble at the church at 1:45 PM and start our walk through the community at 2:00 PM. Family pets are welcome. The total loop is four miles, but you can walk any part of the well-marked route.
