Jeremiah 29:13

A few weeks ago, a group of college students came to Sentinel Lodge for retreat. The group was the Fellowship of Catholic University Students. They enjoyed their time of retreat so much one guest commented Saturday afternoon "I wish we could stay longer." Sunday morning we woke up to snow and the group leader asked if 12 of the guests (who were not comfortable driving in the snowy weather) could stay one more night. We did a quick pivot and the retreat continued.

Sunday afternoon the group rested by the fire and enjoyed time of fellowship together. It was unplanned, but sweet. It made me think of the verse in Jeremiah 29:13. *You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart.* This unplanned time was unwrapped like a present and what was a distraction or delay became additional time alone with God and in fellowship with believers.

As we enter the season of Lent in preparation for Easter, I encourage you to seek the Lord with all your heart. We seek the Lord when we spend time with Him. Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving help in the purposeful seeking.

Prayer: Carve out intentional time with God When you pray, go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father, who is unseen. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. Matthew 6:6

Fasting: Give up something to the Lord.

"The kind of fasting I want is this: remove the chains of oppression and the yoke of injustice, and let the oppressed go free. Share your food with the hungry and open your homes to the homeless poor." Isaiah 58:6

Almsgiving: Give charity to someone in need. "When you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your giving may be in secret. Then your Father, who sees what is done in secret, will reward you. Matthew 6:3-4

Seeking God begins with time with God. It begins with starting our day in prayer, as we seek daily bread through time alone with Him. Choosing God by giving up something (favorite food, social media or entertainment) as a sacrifice of praise! Fasting is as simple as sitting in silence at the same time each day and meditating on a verse of scripture. Seeking God is also about putting others first. Seeing the needs of others, having compassion and helping to meet the need.

I hope you will take purposeful time to seek Him, especially this Easter season.



shocks.


The stable earth, the deep salt sea Around the old eternal rocks.

"Tips for encouraging children to love God's word


